As usual, there are reports and pictures from our village organisations, from the churches and from the Parish Council.

Many thanks to Bob Brock for the cover photo - which this month doesn't show the hills! Do keep sending us your photos.

Plans are now well underway for Bromham's celebrations of The Queen's Platinum Jubilee which will incorporate Bromham Carnival. A large marquee has been booked, which will hold up to 200 people. The costs of the celebrations are being met by the Parish Council, the Carnival Committee and from the proceeds of two fundraising evenings in the Clubhouse organised by Den Fillis, Tracy Collins and a team of helpers. The Sausage Mash and Crumble and the Burger and Chips evenings together raised an impressive £844 towards the Jubilee celebrations. The Parish Council has also applied to Devizes Area Board for a grant towards the costs of the Senior Citizens' lunch.

The centre pages of this issue of The Hoot have all the details of the events that have been planned.

Having the marquee means that as well as the Jubilee celebrations, we can also run some of our traditional Carnival events. The Carnival Procession will be held on Saturday June 4th, and the Carnival Committee are also organising a General Knowledge Quiz and a Bingo evening.

The now well established Teddy Bear Trail will run over the last weekend in June. We will have a report and lots of photos in the next Hoot.

As always, a huge thank you to all of our advertisers who make The Hoot possible. Please do continue to support them. The next issue of The Hoot will be for July - August 2022, and will be distributed at the beginning of July.

BROMHAM PARISH COUNCIL REPORT March / April 2022

A meeting took place on 2nd March between Bromham Parish Council and Bromham Football Club regarding an update on the running of the FBC and the condition of the pavilion. It was reported that work has been completed inside the pavilion with further plans to improve the changing rooms, shower and water system. The electrics have also been inspected and repaired. The Parish Council has allocated £2000 from the Precept.

Parish Council Meeting 14th March:

Traveller's Site, New Road: Laura Mayes gave an update. LM attended a meeting with WC multi agencies too. The WC Dog Warden continues to visit the site. The Enforcement Hearings are set for 30th May.

Wyatt's Lake: Ongoing – recent bonfires reported. Concern regarding the number of inhabited caravans on site. Drainage causing flooding on the A3102 ongoing.

Pound Footpath lighting – difficulty finding a contractor who can install solar lights.

Church Hill Speed: a metro count revealed traffic travelling down the hill at 58MPH and uphill at 59MPH the PC has requested this is again added for a speed extension to the 30MPH limit.

Potholes throughout the village reported to WC.

Minty's Top Bus Stop: Sign erected and is now an official request stop.

Emergency Committee: Regarding recent concerns for vulnerable parishioners during the recent power cuts, The Good Neighbours Volunteers are willing to assist if a committee is formed.

Village Shop: It was reported that the shop will close at the end of March.

Grass Cutting: The contract has again been awarded to Bawdens Contracting Services.

The Wednesday Club has made a request to site a memorial anchor. Size and details requested.

A meeting on 29th April was held to discuss updating the Allotment Tenancy Agreement. Eco Bromham village wild flower/planting areas and Land Registry costs for the Jubilee Field and Social Centre area which was purchased from the Crown.

A meeting with Savill's – The Crown Estate Agents was held on 5th April to discuss the proposed rent increase, a drainage scheme at Hawkstreet and land at the Pound for tree planting.

BPC Meeting 11th April:

The Annual Accounts were presented by the Clerk and agreed and will again be presented at the Annual Parish Meeting on the 29th April.

Santander Business Account: £25,018.82; Investment Account: £21,917.54; Other Accounts: £1,328.60

Total assets at 31 March 2022: £48,264.96 (This includes the Social Centre Rebuild Fund)

The Clerk was awarded a pay rise as recommended by NALC (National Association of Local Clerks)

A342 Speed: Following a further survey of traffic speed it has been recommended that from Sandy Lane to the Calne junction the speed to be reduced to 40MPH and from the Calne junction to the 30 MPH limit at St Edith's Marsh be reduced to 50MPH. This scheme will cost approx. £10,000, with a contribution expected from the Parish Council of 25%. - this is being queried.

A Metro Count has also been requested for Westbrook (Nonsuch House area)

Traveller's Site, New Road: The Clerk to contact Laura Mayes and Danny Kruger regarding Court hearing delays.

Many thanks to Den Fillis and friends who are continuing to raise funds through the café and events for the Social Centre Rebuild and Queens Jubilee Celebrations. Thank you also to all those who have also donated to the Social Centre Rebuild Fund which now stands at £14888.06

Annual Play areas inspection and Risk Assessments to be booked, to also include the BMX track.

Allotments: The small allotment area has been cleared and the vacant plots to be rotavated ready to be re let for the 1st May.

The Jubilee Orchard has now got a commemorative stone and plaque.

The Public WC at the Pavilion is now open again.

CPRE Best Kept village Competition: judging will take place at the end of May.

Next PC Meeting: Monday 9th May 2022.

Wiltshire Welcomes Ukrainian refugees

I'm very pleased that so many local households are opening up their homes to Ukrainian families – thank you to everyone who has been in touch for support. Across the county over 200 households have offered safe homes for people fleeing the war-torn country. Wiltshire Council is putting in additional staffing to provide checks and support for the Ukrainian refugees who are due to settle in Wiltshire under the government's Homes for Ukraine scheme. Officers are working alongside partners to provide sufficient school places, as well as working closely with the NHS, Department for Work and Pensions and town and parish councils.



Schools are working with The Council to continue education for young refugees. There will also be support for early years and post-16 young people when they arrive. Voluntary groups and charities, including LoveUkraine – the Devizes support group, are helping to co-ordinate responses and developing ways to ensure families have the support they need and feel truly welcome when they arrive. If you are hosting a family then please go to www.loveukraine.org so we can ensure the community can support you and your guests.

At the end of the Easter term more than £11,000 was raised by school children across the county after the Wiltshire Youth Council invited schools to join in a non-uniform day on Friday 1 April. The Council encouraged pupils to wear blue and yellow for a minimum of £1 to raise funds for the Disasters Emergency Committee's Ukraine Appeal.

Bromham's plans for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee are fantastic and I look forward to joining in with the celebrations. I'm creating puddings for one of the events so I had better start practicing to ensure they're good enough for the wonderful Bromham residents!

The speaker for our March meeting was one of our own members, Anne Smith. Anne has recently been on a family holiday to Kenya and she gave us a really interesting insight into the Kenyan life style and the wildlife she found there during her travels round the country. John Drew kindly came along with Anne to help show the pictures which really showed what Kenya is like and the many contrasts out there --very modern buildings next to rough dirt roads as an example! Anne had brought back lots of beautiful souvenirs which were on display. They were all beautifully made and the materials used were quite simple-- wood , straw or empty tin cans. The finished articles were really beautiful and often very brightly coloured. For the evening Anne wore a dress made of brightly patterned African material which had been made while she was out in Kenya. The competition for the evening was a holiday souvenir. The winning souvenir was a wooden musical box from Sorrento brought by Sylvia Dalby.

The speaker for our April meeting was Lizzy Etheridge from Fussels Fine Foods. They are based at Church Farm, Rode near Frome and owned by Andy and Tim Fussel, and Lizzy's talk really showed the passion everyone who works on the farm feel about what they do. They originally only grew wheat and barley on their farm for their brewing business. As many farmers have discovered in this country to make a living you have to diversify into other areas, and this has been done very successfully by the Fussel brothers. Andy and Tim now run a haulage firm to transport animals and straw, a building business, a storage business where grain is stored for other farmers in the area, run organised tours round the farm and most importantly grow rapeseed. This rapeseed is turned into award winning oil on their farm, and used in other products they now produce. The various oils, mayonnaises and salad dressings they now make are used by many celebrity chefs and sold at their farm shop, farmers markets and various super markets. Lizzy had brought a lot of their products for us to buy. She also did a cookery demonstration while giving her talk, and Lesley Eacopo, our president, proved to be a very good sous chef chopping up lots of vegetables for Lizzy. The finished dish, a vegetable risotto, was delicious and everyone enjoyed sampling it. The competition was a favourite kitchen gadget, and a garlic press brought by Lesley Eacopo won.

Our next meeting is on May 11th at 7.30pm in the Clubhouse ,when a speaker from Hollychocs in Poulshot will be speaking to us and hopefully bringing some of their lovely chocolates for us to sample. Aldetha Raymond will be giving us a gardening talk and tips at our June meeting on the 8th.

The origins of the Bromham Phoenix Club

The origin of the Bromham Phoenix Club can be taken back to the seventeenth century when in 1612 Sir Henry Bayntun, Lord of Bromham Manor, had six Alms Houses erected on Church Hill to accommodate the elderly of the village.

These dwellings stood for 350 years until they were sold and demolished in 1962, then the money from the sale of the land was held by the Parish Council for the specific use of the elderly. A group of dwellings was erected on the site and named Bayntun Close.

In 1965 it was decided to form a club for the old folk. As the money (mentioned above) was available, the new club was named the "Bromham Bayntun '65 Club" - Bayntun after Sir Henry Bayntun, and 65 reflecting the year of formation, and not the fact that members needed to have reached that age.



This club was successful and lasted well into the late 1980's before it folded because of a lack of members and, once again, the remaining monetary funds were handed back to the Parish Council.

Forward then to September 1992 when Mary Lugg and friends decided to reform the club and this they did. However, when they applied to the Council for funds the few members of the Bayntun 65 club who were still alive objected, saying that they might resurrect their club and would need the money. Because of this members of the new club decided, at the suggestion of Honour Mahoney, that they would name it the "Phoenix Club", as it was - rising from the ashes!

They decided that this club was to be for persons between the ages of 50 and 75. This age range, of course, excluded those who had been members of the Bayntun 65 club, and had objected to 'their' money being used, they now being too old to join the new club.



The Phoenix Club is still in existence and celebrates 30 years of existence this year. The club is for members living in the Bromham area who have reached 50 years of age. The upper age limit has now been removed.
