### **BROMHAM PARISH COUNCIL REPORT September & October 2022**

Travellers Site Update: On going with the site being monitored by WC. Further court case pending in the New Year.

Wiltshire Council Issues:

- A342 Speed reduction: PC querying 25% of £10,000 costs which included Sandy Lane.
- Church Hill 30MPH limit extension: on going.
- New Road 30MPH repeater signs: approved to be installed January-March.
- **Metro Count at Nonsuch:** measured speeds are within the agreed percentile. A request received and forwarded to WC for the 40MPH speed limit in Westbrook to be extended towards Melksham.
- **Badgers in the Churchyard Extension:** this has been inspected by WC and agreed that there has been no recent activity.

**Lights at the Pound:** prices are still being requested to provide 3 additional lights.

**Village Water Pressure:** following concern raised again by the PC regarding water pressure in the village centre, Wiltshire and Dorset fire brigade has put extra requests for water bowsers etc. if a fire occurs in Bromham. The PC is also requesting an upgrade to the mains supply into the village centre.

Parish Plan: Quotations required for a consultant to complete the plan

**Social Centre Rebuild:** The PC has requested and received the insurance and contents cover from their own insurers Aviva a total of £751,967. The PC had already had a drawdown of £50,000 to cover the expenses of clearing the site and providing the Clubhouse. All organisations that had contents stored and destroyed have now been paid, leaving £692,589.00 plus donations and funds of £28,028.59.

Coronation Celebrations: a marquee has been provisionally booked

**Football Club:** more renovations are to be carried out in the Pavilion by the club with the PC agreeing to pay £1800.00 towards a new hot water system and removal of the old showers.

Allotments: The PC is still negotiating a new lease with the Crown Estate for the 100 acres of Bromham allotment land.

**Winter Warm Space:** is being investigated by Caroline Culley and volunteers.

**St Nicholas Pudding Run:** There will be no overnight parking in the Social Centre car park as it will be closed from Saturday evening 3rd December until Sunday after the race.

Youth Club: The AGM will be in January, when a Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and new committee will be appointed.

DOG FOULING: This is a major issue on the football pitches in both the Jubilee Field and Millennium fields.

NO DOGS ARE ALLOWED ON THE JUBILEE FIELD. THIS IS COVERED BY WILTSHIRE COUNCIL BYELAWS, WITH A FINE OF £1000 FOR ANYONE PROSECUTED.

Dogs are allowed in the Millennium Field if kept under control i.e. on a lead. This field is used for youth training. It is the responsibility of dog owners to clean up after their dog, bagged waste can be deposited in the waste bins.

Dog fouling is a major concern to many people, not just because of the mess it causes, but because it can be a health risk. Dogs may deposit roundworm eggs (toxocara canis) in their faeces, which become infectious after about 3 weeks, and can remain so for up to 2 years. Anyone, but particularly children playing near to the ground, can run the risk of picking up and swallowing the eggs. The eggs then hatch in the intestine, burrow through the intestine wall into the blood stream and pass into the body.

### Notes from the Belfry

Have you been wondering why the bells sounded different – muffled – during the period of mourning following the sad death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II in early September?

Muffling the bells is an ancient tradition usually reserved for very solemn occasions. On Remembrance Sunday we ring the bells 'half muffled' – that is, we attach leather pads to cover one side of each clapper, thus softening the sound. However, for the death of a monarch we ring the bells 'fully muffled', leaving just one side of the tenor clapper only uncovered.

On the Queen's passing, towers countrywide received instructions from the CCCBR (Central Council of Church Bell Ringers) on how and when bells should be rung. We had long been aware of 'Operation London Bridge' and had been preparing accordingly. Most towers, ourselves included, only possess one set of muffles, so we had been thinking how we could adapt what we had without spending a small fortune on a second set. Our muffles are attached to the ball of the clapper with leather thongs. We obtained some square pieces of leather, punched holes in the four corners and threaded the thongs through. It worked a treat.

The day after the Queen's death was announced, eight of us assembled in the tower just before midday and rang the bells fully muffled. Then, on Sunday 18th September we rang before and after a service of thanksgiving held at St Nicholas'. Finally, on 19th September Steve Pardoe tolled the tenor for one hour before the funeral, after which the muffles were removed and put away until needed again on Remembrance Sunday.



**Update:** Work on the tower is scheduled to start on 21st January 2023 and will probably take 2 months, during which time the bells and the clock will be out of action.

Our churches belong to all of us in the community, to have fun in, to be there for private time and reflection, to keep our lives on an even keel in today's difficult times, to be thankful for everything that we hold dear.

With your help, we can get our Churches thriving again.

### **Bromham Phoenix Club**

### PHOENIX CLUB TRIP ON THE 4TH OCTOBER 2022

Unfortunately we couldn't travel through Cheddar Gorge on our way to Weston-Super-Mare as planned, due to tree-felling for ash die-back, so we headed straight for the coast. The weather was sunny and breezy and the tide was well out when our coach dropped us off right on the promenade near the "See Monster (spelling is correct). There was a queue of school children waiting to go on, so most of our party decided to wait until later.

The See Monster is a retired offshore platform from the North Sea, transformed into one of the UK's largest public art installations. The monster is the biggest platform of it's kind to tell stories, inspiring global conversations about re-use, renewables and the great British weather. It is on three levels: Cellar Deck, Garden Lab and Helideck. There is a lift available if you don't want to climb the stairs. Each level has it's own interesting features, and from the top there are fantastic views, an amphitheatre style seating, soothing sounds of the shipping forecast. You can also descend down the 10 metre curly slide to the level below if you are brave enough. It will only be there for another month when it will be taken to Holland for dismantling, which seems a shame. It is also free of charge.

Weston has links to a large number of distinguished people, who have been commemorated on "Blue Plaques" in the town. Deborah Kerr, the well-known actress, came to live here in 1938 until she left in 1957 for Hollywood. Roald Dahl spent 4 years here from the age of 9 and apparently wrote his novel "Matilda" based on characters from St. Peters School which he attended. A ruinous medieval barn was converted into a "National School" in 1865 by John Norton and is now Worle School in Weston. John Norton is best known for building Tyntesfield near Wraxall. Though Bob Hope was born in London, his grand-father, who was a stone mason, brought his family to Weston and helped build Weston's new seafront wall in 1883. They lived in Weston until moving to America and his grand-father joined the stone carvers on the Statue of Liberty. In 1976 The Queen made Bob Hope an honorary knight.

At 4.00p.m, after visiting The See Monster, and having a welcome coffee we made our journey home arriving back at about 5.30.p.m. after a lovely day out.

### **UPDATE FROM THE SOCIAL CENTRE REBUILD COMMITTEE**

As you will know, we have been patiently waiting for some months to receive a response from the insurers of the roofer regarding our claim for uninsured damages. Unfortunately, we have now been formally notified that the roofers' insurers are not accepting insurance liability for his actions. We are working with our insurers to see if we can pursue the roofer on a personal basis, but we are not hopeful that this would bridge the gap.

This means that the starting point for the budget for rebuilding the Social Centre is the £750k received from our insurers (now in the Parish Council bank account) plus any additional funds that we can raise for a new hall.

Clearly, this means we cannot afford everything we would like and there are going to need to be compromises made in what we can afford to build. We believe we need a budget of around £1.25m to design and build a Social Centre that will meet the immediate needs of the village.

Our approach will be to deliver and build what we can as soon as possible, but to include in the design plan the possibility of future expansion as and when funding permitted. We would also intend to apply for outline planning permission for subsequent stages at the same time as for the initial build.

The committee are looking at various ways to meet the need for additional funding. These include grant applications - for example to The National Lottery, local large donors and individual donations. The Parish Council can also apply to the government for a Public Works Loan that would be repaid by an increase to the parish precept.

We will need to justify everything we do with support from the whole village, particularly if we are proposing to raise the council tax precept to help fund the rebuild. This means that there is a requirement to move forward on the basis of what we can afford based on concept, content and a business case.

In order to move forward, the Rebuild Committee has set up two initial work streams reporting back to the Rebuild Committee, and to the Parish Council for decisions.

Concept and Content workstream led by Peter Hindle, to develop a design brief (and possibly an outline layout) for an architect. This needs to balance what we can afford with the priorities that the village has told us it needs - based on the results of the survey earlier this year. Initial thoughts of this workstream are: a building with flexible spaces that can be configured to a hall similar in size to the old one when required, or used separately; kitchen and bar facilities to support large events and use as a community café / bar; making better use of the outside area.

**Business Case** workstream led by Graham Prichard which is developing a business case for what can be justified in the new hall. This has studied the accounts and footfalls of the Owl and the old Social Centre. We need to get this business case into a robust document to support any grant applications or funding bids from e.g., the Lottery. The final design concept needs to be fully justified by the business case.

As well as the two work streams above there are other aspects that will need work at the same time. Village fundraising will be critical and the Clubhouse Cafe has been a great lead, however we need to coordinate all the village event fundraising.

To press on with the new hall we need to engage with the Parish Council and get decisions and some actions from them as soon as possible.

The Rebuild Committee will ask the Parish Council to:

- Accept the principle of a building supporting a hall of similar proportions to the old hall but delivered as a flexible space.
- Approve the design concept and the business case as they are completed.
- Agree size of the Public Works Loan to be requested and start the application asap. The maximum envisaged cost would be £1.25 million but we are hopeful of a lesser spend. For information, a £250k Public Works Loan at current rates would put an additional £19 per annum on a Band D precept. This would require agreement from the whole village.
- Discuss including a possible replacement dwelling (for the flat in the old Social Centre) in the Planning application for future sale or rent to help service a loan
- Investigate and consider a shop option as a future income stream (commercial franchise?)
- In due course discuss and determine a management model for the future social centre

If we move forward with determination and work in parallel, we believe we could: get a concept / design brief together by Christmas; start architects' detail design work in January; apply to Planning in the spring; start building in early autumn, with a target of completing the project by Carnival 2024.



For a complete list of tips on preparing your garden for winter look on the Garden Organic website. It suggests collecting fallen autumn leaves to make leafmould. Keep turning the waste in your compost bins so it is ready to use in the spring. Entice birds into the vegetable garden by feeding them. They will repay you by eating many insect pests hidden under leaves.

### **BROMHAM CARNIVAL AGM - 13 OCTOBER 2022**

### **Chairman's Report**

Due to Covid, this was the first formal AGM since October 2019. At that meeting we were looking forward to celebrating our Diamond Jubilee and starting to prepare a huge programme of events to mark the occasion.



The outbreak of Covid meant that sadly we had to cancel Carnival completely in 2020. We had thought we might be able to organise a Carnival in 2021 if we delayed it until July - but Covid restrictions changed again. This meant that Wiltshire Council were unable to issue an event license – so once again we had to cancel Carnival.

Then in June 2021 the Social Centre was destroyed by fire ...

We did manage to organise the Teddy Bear Trail in 2021 at the end of July. We were immensely grateful to St Nicholas School for letting us use the school as a starting point for the Trail. As well as fantastic support from the village we had visitors from as far afield as Bristol and Swindon, and we raised an amazing £3500.

The Queen's Platinum Jubilee this year gave us the opportunity to share in the cost of a marquee with the Jubilee Committee and work together to plan an amazing week of celebration. The marquee was literally full to overflowing for both the General Knowledge Quiz and the Bingo evening and Carnival Day itself exceeded all expectations. Even the weather was kind to us, and the threatened rain turned into a short shower at dawn and full sun for the procession.

Huge thanks to everyone who donated raffle prizes, gave up time to set up the marquee and help at events. So many people have told us that it was the best Carnival ever! There were certainly more people on the field than I have seen.

As Cathy will report, despite only running a few events and having to pay £1000 towards the cost of hiring the marquee, we still raised an amazing £5500 after expenses.

During the time since the last AGM we have seen a number of committee members leave us:

On behalf of the committee, I'd like to thank them all for their huge contribution to Bromham Carnival over many years, and I hope we can continue to live up to their standards.

Finally, can I say a huge thank you to all of the committee who have worked incredibly hard over the past 3 years, who have adapted quickly to changes beyond our control, and still kept smiling and positive.

### St Nicholas CofE VC Primary School

Thank you very much to everyone who visited the Netherstreet Plant Sale at the end of April and purchased/donated – your contribution has been very well spent by the school and will benefit the children for many years to come.

We needed new benches for our outside area to enable the children to work outside when possible. Alongside the generous donation from the Netherstreet Plant Sale and money given by the Friends of St Nicholas School - PTA from the Pudding Run, we purchased four benches that can accommodate six children per bench with access either side for wheelchairs or another chair. The benches are made from recycled plastic and are environmentally friendly. They are far more durable than the old wooden benches that require regular maintenance and can splinter.







The children use the benches for various outdoor learning activities and packed lunches. They have already had a great deal of use during the beautiful summer and September we have had.

### **Forest Schools**

The Forest Schools project has been running for some years, but as you can imagine during the past two years it has not been able to continue. With changes in staffing and reorganisation of resources, we are now in a position with our new Forest School Leader, Mrs Chillitupa, to resurrect the Forest Schools Outdoor Learning with a willing group of volunteers. This clearly enhances the pupils learning giving them a wider understanding of the outside world and an appreciation of our natural habitat. It incorporates Science, Maths, PSHE, English as well as many other aspects of our everyday school life. The pupils get an insight into growing vegetables and the natural habitat of insects and other wildlife. Various equipment is required to give the children a flavour of the skills used in outdoor living such as wood carving, magnifying glasses to look at bugs in their natural habitat and making fire safely for cooking and keeping warm.
