Report of Bromham Parish Council Meeting held on December 11th 2023

Parishioners' 10 minutes:

Den Fillis acknowledged the donation of a Christmas Tree from Moors Wood Farm.

Laura Mayes update:

- Flooding in Hawkstreet This has been particularly bad recently and it is highly recommended that a Village Flood Plan should be put in place as a matter of urgency. With such a plan in place Wiltshire Council will be better able to provide practical help. A meeting with the new Highways Manager, Andy Cadwalladar, has been arranged and the flooding in Hawkstreet will be discussed.
- Planning Permission for 64 Hawkstreet It has been noted that much of the work carried out at this property has not followed the agreed planning permission. This has been passed to the planning enforcement officer who will be monitoring both the planning permission for the 5 bar gate and also for a garage, both of which have contravened planning permission.
- **Travellers site** Since the case was heard in February and there is still no decision made by the judge, the barristers are now pushing for the long overdue judgment.
- **Wyatts Lake** a short term improvement with the installation of a pump but a drain needs to be put in and this has been agreed by the owner.

Minutes Update:

- Hedge cutting/brambles no update as yet but this will be done
- High St. Trees no update
- Dog bins new one to be installed in Hawkstreet, checking if new bin has been ordered.
- Clerk's laptop new laptop has been purchased
- Chittoe Heath no update. Fallen trees were removed promptly and two further trees were felled as they were deemed to be unsafe
- First Aid Course Ian Tuckett will be running a First Aid Course for anyone interested which will take place in the new year. Cost will be dependent on numbers but could be free unless a certificate is required. Please contact Ian to register interest.
- Pavilion Clock Work ongoing, wiring needs to be replaced as it is currently unsafe.
- Accident Book HSE compliant accident book now in Clubhouse and any accidents to be recorded and stored safely
- Parish Website Possible refresh required for better provision of Parish Council documents and also dedicated email addresses for all councillors.

Neighbourhood Plan.

Meeting of the Neighbourhood Plan committee took place on 9th December. The aim is to meet the government requirement to provide 65 new houses by 2036. Good progress has been made to date with small sites having been proposed.

Concerns raised around preventing a developer coming which could result in a large housing development. The village needs to have a plan in place to help prevent this from happening and will still need to go to a village vote.

Community Hub.

- The planning application has been submitted as agreed at previous parish council meeting and is awaiting approval.
- Still looking into a possible claim against the Trustees Indemnity Insurance. It is unclear if a claim can be made, all available documentation needs to be examined and then legal advice to be sought to give clarity on the viability of a claim being possible.
- Lottery Grant Waiting for Planning Application to be approved.

Allotments/Crown Lease.

New rental agreement with the Crown to be signed on the 25/03/24 which will result in an increase in rental charges for allotments.

Play Area Inspections.

Checked and all good.

Skatepark.

No issues reported.

Defibrillator Inspection.

Five defibrillators in the Village, one in Hawkstreet requires a new battery at a cost of £285

- Concerns that proposed figure will not be enough to cover the rise in expenses and costs.
- The lower figure was agreed by the majority of Parish Councillors as it kept the cost to villagers below £10

 purpose of seeking or receiving legal advice are covered by legal and professional privilege and therefore do not have
 to be discussed in response to a FOI request."

Notes from the Belfry

At the end of November we held a training morning for members of the Calne Branch using our simulator. This is a device connected to light sensors on the bell frame which generate an electrical pulse when reflectors on the bell wheels pass in front of them. The electrical pulse produces a simulated bell sound very like the real thing in the ringing chamber. (We immobilise the clappers so that no sound can be heard outside).

The first ringing simulator was invented back in the 1970s by a retired electronic engineer called Peter Cummins using discreet logic. His invention was modified several times before it was produced commercially. Ours is one of very few of these still in use countrywide having been superseded by the PC and the development of ringing software.

It was a bright sunny morning when we gathered for our training session which was going very well until strange things started to happen. The tenor bell was making extra dongs. We tried pressing various buttons to no avail until it dawned on me what was causing the problem. The winter sun, being low in the sky, was shining onto the sensors sending extra pulses to the simulator! So we switched off the sound and continued 'ringing' until the sun had moved on. Problem solved!

This year it was our turn to host the joint Calne and Devizes branches' Carol Service on the second Saturday in December. Last year it was hosted by South Wraxall in the Devizes branch, a newly rehung ring of six bells which had been silent for many years. The bells there are rung from the ground floor so ringers could hang about in the church waiting for their turn. Our ringing chamber can hold about twenty at a push so it was a tight squeeze. However, all those who wanted to ring did so in the 90 minutes before the service. This was a lovely occasion attended by more than fifty ringers who filled the church with their singing and the afternoon was rounded off with a 'bring and share' tea.

VILLAGE ORGANISATIONS & ACTIVITIES

Bromham W I

At the November meeting of Bromham W I we enjoyed an interesting and informative talk by Joan Harrington on the tradition of well dressing in Derbyshire. The tradition of well dressing takes place between May and July around the villages in Derbyshire, and has been a tradition that was started in the middle ages when it was thought that dressing the wells in villages would protect the population in that area from any disaster, such as the Black Death. It takes quite a few people to dress the wells and it takes about a week to finish the well. The wells are surrounded by wooden structures which are filled with a deep layer of clay and the design is then made in the clay. Any natural material is used to make the design ,such as flowers, fir cones, pebbles or vegetables. Joan showed us a lot of pictures of the finished wells over the years, and the designs were really beautiful.

For our December meeting we were entertained by Brian and Kelly Tilley. Brian plays French bagpipes and the hurdy-gurdy and Kelly the hurdy-gurdy. Brian and Kelly play mostly as a twosome, and have played all over the county in various venues. They play mostly French music but sometimes Scandinavian. The hurdy-gurdy is a stringed instrument and the single notes played on the instrument sound similar to those of a violin. It is a French instrument and originated in the monasteries hundreds of years ago. Marie Antoinette played the hurdy-gurdy and bagpipes so consequently all the nobility in the French court at the time learnt to play these instruments. In France the bagpipe remains an important instrument in French traditional music. The instruments were beautiful to look at and took enormous skill to play. After our musical entertainment we enjoyed mulled wine and delicious festive food provided by the members. It was a lovely evening, and as the Clubhouse was beautifully decorated for Christmas there was a real festive spirit around.

Our first meeting in the New Year is on Wednesday January 10th, when Sue Roberts will be our speaker with a talk entitled " A bird's eye view of an investiture". Meetings start at 7.30pm in the Clubhouse and visitors are always welcome.














We have also created stockings to hang on the fireplace. We have been enjoying lots of Christmas crafting in the lead up to the holidays which the children have thoroughly enjoyed.

Welcome to our new Nursery Manager

Our Nursery Manager Kelly is due to start maternity leave very soon. We have been very fortunate to find a new manager who has lots of experience working in early years settings. We would like to introduce Lynne.

Hello - I'm Lynne and I can't wait to get to know you and your children better when I start at Busy Kids in January. I have been teaching since 2004, and working in Management since 2012. Before moving to Bromham last year, I spent many years living in London where I led two maintained nursery schools.

I know a little bit about agriculture having worked for the Agricultural Training Board as a training adviser and video producer, back in the last century! I also have a bit of experience in the construction industry as I spent a number of years working for the Centre for Educational Resources in the Construction Industry. But since having my own children my greatest passion has been the importance and availability of Early Years Education. I have been lucky enough to observe early education and childcare in many European Countries which enabled me to introduce the best aspects of this learning into my own practice and cascade the outcomes of these experiences to other practitioners.



People often ask me if I miss London to which I reply "no". I miss the friends we had there but I really wanted to come here. My first grandchild lives nearby and I can claim descendance from the Salter's of Kington Langley, whom I have traced back there 500 years. I love getting involved in village events and have enjoyed being a part of the Thursday ramblers group.

In London I was lucky enough to work a 5 minute push scooter ride away from my schools, here, if I follow the footpaths across the fields, it's about a 15 minute walk, but that might be more of a summer activity.

I have been looking for the right position since I moved to Bromham, whilst carrying out supply work in local primary schools, I have found my new home at Busy Kids.





The Trustees of Bromham Community Hub are delighted to announce that on 22nd December 2023 we were notified that our application for funding support has been successful and we have been awarded a £300,000 grant from the Government 'Community Ownership Fund'.

This funding will provide much needed support for rebuilding the Bromham Community Hub and gives a huge boost to our fundraising efforts. £50,000 of this grant is to provide support for the administrative and technical support we need for a project of this size and the remaining £250,000 is allocated to the construction costs of the building.

We believe we still need to raise up to a further £250,000 towards the costs of completing and fitting out the building, but we have also had a positive response to our initial enquiry for £100,000 from the Lottery Fund. Lottery applications require the actual cost of the project confirmed, not just an estimate. We are currently starting to prepare documents to tender the design and build contract, identify the full costs, and to be able to appoint our construction company partner.

As we will have been given a Government grant we will be subject to their continual scrutiny throughout the procurement and development processes and on into the operational phase of the new Hub, so we will be expected to follow the business plan we submitted with our bid for funding.



Meanwhile in December, we made further progress in two other important areas:

- 1) The formal planning application for the new Bromham Community Hub has been successfully submitted to Wiltshire Council along with all the supporting documents and surveys that are required. Copies of two of the drawings are on this page, more details and the full set of documents can be found on the Community Hub and the Bromham village websites. The link to the full planning application will be posted on social media and on the websites as soon as it is received from Wiltshire Council.
- 2) HMRC has confirmed that as a registered Charity, Bromham Community Hub can claim "Gift Aid". This means that we can claim the income tax paid by you back from HMRC on all donations made to BCH. So for every £50 donated by individuals, gift aid will be claimed and HMRC will pay £12.50 directly into the Hub account.

Now that Gift Aid registration has been confirmed, Mel Watt formally launched the Buy-a-Brick campaign just before Christmas to support the fundraising for the Hub. We have asked the architects to design in a feature wall built from the bricks donated through the scheme and would like to encourage everybody to support this effort. The bricks have a minimum price of £50 but there is no maximum price, that choice is yours; every donation big and small (along with 25% claimed back from HMRC) is an important step toward the total. The wreaths will be kept carefully for future ceremonies.

Marquees, gazebos, tables and chairs all had to be loaned, fetched and assembled beforehand and returned afterwards. £1,800 was raised, enabling us to make donations of £400 to St Nichs School, Bromham Youth Club and to this wonderful village magazine, £350 to the Monday Club, £150 to the Mother's Union to give a local family struggling with the cost of living a holiday, and £100 to our local branch of the Royal British Legion.
