Report of Bromham Parish Council Meetings held in January and February

(This is a 'summing up' of the minutes – full minutes can be seen on notice boards around the village and on the website)

Flooding

The village has had a few issues to deal with in the first couple of months of 2024 not least of which was the inclement weather which resulted in some of the worst flooding the village has experienced in recent years.

Floodwater reached the homes of a few residents in St. Edith's Marsh, there were abandoned cars in Hawkstreet, part of the High Street opposite Greystones seemed to disappear underwater at the slightest drop of rain, sections of Yard Lane were badly flooded, Durlett Road and New Road fared badly as well.

Wiltshire Council and Bromham Parish Council are taking action – in December, January and again this month gullies are being jetted by Wiltshire Council and there is a working group of parish councillors putting together a Village Flood Plan.

A map of the Village has been produced with flooding 'hot spots' highlighted, gullies have been inspected, landowners will be contacted, and an ongoing plan of action will be produced to try and prevent a repeat of the extent of recent flooding. Many villagers have also been involved with the flood plan drawing on their years of experience in the village and invaluable local knowledge.

Once the Village Flood Plan has been completed it will be posted on the website. However, this will be an ongoing plan which will evolve over time, contact names, numbers and emails will be available for any parishioners who wish to offer help.

Potholes

Another issue in the Village, which has been exacerbated by the flooding, is potholes. These can be reported to Wiltshire Council via the MyWilts app on their website. All reports made using this app have to be investigated by Wiltshire Council, and whilst their action may not be immediate, (there are even worse potholes in other areas of the county) they will be repaired.

Wiltshire Council have completed setting their budget for the year and unlike many counties in the UK they are financially healthy. With the issue of flooding and potholes in mind they have made an additional £10 million investment in pothole repairs and bought a new gully jetting machine.

Regular Agenda Items

- **Wyatts Lake:** The flooding in the dip of the road by the entrance has improved with the installation of a pump, the council still plan to run a pipe under the road which will be better as a long-term solution to the flooding. There have also been reports of a lot of dumping of topsoil on the site and the banks are very high on the roadside. Laura Mayes is following this up along with other ongoing issues with this site.
- **High Street Trees:** Concern around the trees at Battle House obscuring the streetlights, also if any of the trees came down it would take the wall with it which could have a devastating outcome. Laura Mayes is meeting with the owner to discuss a solution.
- **Dog bins:** A new bin has been installed next to the telephone box in Hawkstreet, this replaces the underused bin in the Chantry. The bin just off the Pound has been replaced with a much larger one as the previous post mounted bin was frequently overflowing.

Updates

- **First Aid Course:** This was very well attended, in fact fully booked and already a waiting list for the next one, many thanks to Ian Tuckett who ran the course. A second course is to be arranged.
- **Best Kept Village:** Bromham will again be entering, and the first round of judging will be between the 13th of May and the 9th of June.
- **Tree planting:** There has been a request to plant fruit trees at the back of Pond Field behind the tennis court. This has been agreed in principle with the proviso that enough space is left for the carnival floats to gather.
- **Village Website:** It was agreed that the website could be updated/refreshed. A working group will look at various options. The content will stay the same to start with but will be easier to navigate and visually more appealing.
- **Electric Vehicle charging station in the Village:** It is likely that the Community Hub may need to have at least two EV charging stations. There are many options for rural EV charging stations and more information/advice is needed to explore which may be the best option for Bromham. A presentation to be arranged for the next PC meeting.
- Policy and Procedure Updates: All policies and procedures are required to be updated annually. It was agreed that
 rather than taking up time in the PC meetings that a working group would carry out the reviews and all changes or
 updates to be presented at the meetings for approval.
- Clerk's phone: There is now a contact number for the parish clerk 07368 251 532

Community Hub

- The offer of a £300,000 was great news for the whole village and both the Parish Council and Community Hub CIO are working towards meeting the conditions of the grant set in place by the Community Ownership Fund (COF). Only once these conditions have been complied with and confirmation of such received, will the grant be signed off and funds released.
- The conditions the COF are seeking confirmation of from the Parish Council are:
 - 1. Bromham Community Hub CIO is to assume all responsibility for the procurement of construction partners, the Client role in relation to the management of the construction contract and the ongoing responsibility for day-to-day management of the new Community Hub following construction completion and handover.
 - 2. All monies currently held by the PC for the rebuilding project, will be wholly transferred to Bromham Community Hub CIO and that these funds have been fully cleared of any residual encumbrances. We seek assurances that no future challenge can be made by any third parties against the monies transferred to us. Also, we request that the relevant project accounts of income and expenditure to date are made available to us for the completeness of our project records.
 - 3. That an Agreement to lease and an accompanying 125-year lease will be drawn up by the PC and granted to Bromham Community Hub CIO for the parcel of land required to build and operate the Bromham Community Hub. Also, please can you confirm that this will be agreed at the earliest opportunity and no later than 31st March 2024, to allow Bromham Community Hub CIO to enter into the construction contract at the end of the procurement process.
- The Parish Council can confirm points 1 and 3 but point 2 is still ongoing.
- In order to move forwards with point two the following proposal was resolved unanimously at the January Parish Council meeting:
 - The Parish Council recommends that the Social Centre Charity Trustees give instruction to a solicitor to write to the Charity Commission to dissolve the Social Centre Charity and to transfer all assets to Bromham Community Hub.
 - The 'SCMC' will continue as a Subcommittee of the Parish Council with the same structure 4 elected members, 9 representatives of specific Village organisations and no more than 3 co-opted members. Funding will be organised through the Parish Council. They will hold an AGM every March.
 - The Parish Council will transfer £375,000 in an initial tranche with a commitment to provide further funds when requested by the Community Hub CIO. Proposed JB, Seconded CT. RESOLVED by unanimous vote.

The next Parish Council meeting will be on Monday the 11th of March.

All Parish Council minutes are available on the Village website when approved.

ROWDE, BROMHAM & SANDY LANE BENEFICE

As I write, we have just begun Lent – the six weeks before we reach the great Christian festival of Easter. You probably know it as a period of abstinence. The often-asked question is: what are you giving up for Lent? But Lent is also a period of waiting and quiet reflection.



As many of you will know, we are still waiting for the post of Rector to be filled. In the meantime the two parishes of Bromham and Rowde rely on me as Associate Priest (I also do other, paid, work so have limited time) and retired and part-time priests from elsewhere to keep things going. Members of the congregation, of course, do huge amounts of work to maintain a sense of community, working with the school and others.

Waiting is never easy, is it? It's full of uncertainty and no little frustration. It can make us bad-tempered and anxious. But we have a role model in Jesus, who dealt with all the frustrations of life with calmness. He saw the best in some of the most difficult of people, who others dismissed. Even his dealings with those in power, who would eventually be responsible for his death, seem tinged with regret and sadness at their lack of understanding, rather than anger. Christians believe that Jesus was God, but there is no sense of entitlement in anything he did. These are the qualities that made people want to follow him and learn from him.

As you read this, you are probably looking forward to Easter eggs. At Easter the Church celebrates the risen Christ and remembers that all our waiting and our patient reflection is rewarded by joy.

VILLAGE ORGANISATIONS & ACTIVITIES

Phoenix Club

The Phoenix Club held its last ever meeting on the 12 December 2023 with a Christmas Event held at The Lansdowne Hall, Derry Hill. We had a very enjoyable time with a delicious Christmas themed buffet delivered to each table, which was ordered from Serena Dalby. Each person was provided with a small bottle of wine, either to drink with their meal or to take home, plus a free raffle ticket for the raffle prizes provided from club funds. We had entertainment afterwards from some members of CLOGS Musical Theatre from Chippenham, who performed a programme of Christmas songs and some songs from shows.

Phoenix Club Financial Information

The club started the year in September with £2,126.20. No charge was made for membership as the club was closing at Christmas 2023. Subsidies from club funds for club activities and donations of remaining funds are as follows:

- Club Meetings subsidy £91.94
- Christmas Event subsidy £585.63
- 3 Coach Trips subsidy £678.00

From the remaining funds a donation for the new Wednesday Friendly Club started by Dennis Powney in January of £200.00 was made. This was for prepaid Clubhouse Hire of 10 x 2 hour sessions to enable this new start up to begin, knowing that many Phoenix Club members would be attending.

The remaining balance £570.63 was donated to The Bromham and Rowde Monday Club at their meeting on 15/01/2024.

The above donations were made as per votes by our members wishes when we announced closure and comply with the Phoenix Club Constitution on the winding up of the club. The donations will also benefit previous Phoenix members who attend these events.

Sue Roberts from Hilperton was our first speaker in 2024 and her talk was entitled "A bird's eye view of a Royal Investiture". Sue's talk was fascinating and gave us a real insight in to what happened at these events. There are about 14 investitures held every year, and they are carried out with almost military precision and detail. Sue herself had participated in an investiture having received the MBE in the New Years Honours in 1994. She had been in the WRENS for 22 years and received her honour for her naval work, her sporting achievements and charity work. While she was in the navy, Sue had taken up rifle shooting and eventually became the English team captain in official competitions. When she retired from the navy she helped take disabled children to Lourdes. LAURA MAYES - Wiltshire Councillor for Bromham, Rowde & Roundway

By the time you read this article, Wiltshire Council will have agreed its budget for 2024/25 at the Full Council meeting on Tuesday 20 February. You will have heard about other Councils across the country who are struggling to balance their books, and in some cases going bust. I am pleased that Wiltshire Council continues with its prudent and preventative approach, putting it in a strong position to deliver on its Business Plan priorities to ensure high quality services for Wiltshire's residents, businesses, and communities.



The most significant spending in 2024/25 will be:

Adult services - £179.4m; Families and children - £70.8m; Environment - £49.5m; Highways and transport - £43m; Education and skills - £35.1m

Despite the challenging financial climate nationally, Wiltshire Council will still be investing in key services and programmes. It has allocated an extra £10m over the next two years for filling potholes, road resurfacing and verge repairs. This funding is in addition to the £25.9m the council receives from the Government for Highways Maintenance. Also included in the budget is an additional £1 million investment into extra gully cleaning work and reactive pothole filling. This is on top of the £1 million that was invested into improving drainage in 2022 and will effectively treble drainclearing work since 2021.

Flooding has been the top issue for the Bromham area in the last few months. I have been inundated with calls from residents who have been affected by the excessive rain. I am pleased Bromham Parish Council have agreed to create a Flood Plan for the area. I will work with the Parish Council, residents, landowners and Wiltshire Council to make this happen. It will take a few months to identify the key sites and the best action to take but I urge everyone affected to get involved with the process. This includes seeing if you can do anything to your own property and its surroundings to alleviate the problem.



We have pressed the Go button! While it may not look as if much is happening, a lot of work is now going on in the background.

Read on to find out more about what is going on, what the timeline is, how we are doing with funding, and how you can help. If you are a business interested in becoming a sub-contractor, there are details on how to register your interest.

1. Design and Construction

Oxford Architects were originally engaged by the Parish Council to take the design up to the planning submission stage. The formal planning application was submitted at the start of January and put out for consultation. We now await a decision from Wiltshire Council. A number of compulsory survey reports were submitted as part of the application but we have now been informed that we need to commission and submit a further Flood Risk Report. Organising this work is now underway.

The lease of the parcel of land required to build and operate the Bromham Community Hub is being drawn up by the Parish Council's solicitors. The lease covers the approximate footprint of the old Social Centre from the western edge of the car park up to the boundary hedge at the rear.

With the welcome news of the £300,000 Community Ownership Fund (COF) grant also came the realisation that the grant needs to be fully spent by 22nd December 2024. That meant we had to rethink our approach to ensure that we could move forward as quickly as possible and ensure that the grant money could be spent by the deadline.

We intend to engage a contractor for a 'Design and Build' contract, but with only the planning drawings to go on there would be a lot of unknowns for the contractors to try and price. The contractor would be guessing the best design solutions and would be cautious about providing a low fixed price.

While we wait for the planning permission decision, we will work up more basic detail for a cost-effective design solution with the architects and structural engineers before we ask contractors to price. This will save design time later, the contractors will all be pricing accurately for the same design solution and they will have more knowledge of how they need to run the project. This means we have avoided these early design costs being included within the main construction contract and ensured that we can start spending the grant funds immediately. It is hoped that the appointed contractor will agree to 'novate' the architects and engineers for the Design phase in the Design and Build contract so that we have continuity until the end of the project.

We have made all appointment decisions following our Trust Procedure Rules and with the approval of the COF. Bromham Community Hub (BCH) has now engaged Oxford Architects to continue the overall design and co-ordinate the information from other disciplines. We have engaged Giraffe Engineering (Chippenham) to provide structural engineering design services, and Envirotas Consultancy (Melksham) to produce a specification for mechanical and electrical installations. We are about to appoint the specialist construction legal services needed to assist with the contractual arrangement and our other legal duties, and we will shortly be looking to engage a Quantity Surveyor to work with us through to the end of the project. Needless to say we have negotiated hard for charity rates and for that we thank all our partners.

Forming this design team group means that they are now working up the initial design of the building. The structural engineers will design the frame and the size and shape of the frame will in turn influence other design details in the building for the architects. The Mechanical and Electrical requirements also need to be co-ordinated into the architectural and structural design at this stage.

We are now moving on to consulting with other specialists to start off specifying all the other aspects that must be included, for example Wifi, Lighting, Audio, Screens, Heating, Cooling, Kitchens the list goes on. When we have some initial ideas to put forward, we will be asking those with expertise in the village to help refine them.

2. Timeline

The timeline we are now following has the following key target dates.

Architects, Structural Engineers and M&E consultants appointed	February 2024
Planning Permission granted	March 2024
Issue Invitation to Tender	April 2024

Formal appointment of contractor	July 2024
Start on site for advance works (drainage, electricity, water, telecoms etc)	September 2024

Opening Events	Carnival week 2025

Clearly we are dependent on weather and a lot of other factors to make this happen but we will try our best to be open for Carnival 2025.

3. Grants

We have had valuable assistance from our Wiltshire councillor Laura Mayes who provided links to the Climate Change team in Wiltshire Council. We have now identified that BCH is eligible to apply for community grants from the National Grid, who have two major projects impacting on the Bromham area: one is the pylon removal project on Roundway and the second is a pylon refurbishment programme running from Berkshire to Melksham.

We are in the process of applying for a grant to help pay for efficient air source heat pumps for the building. We are also exploring funding for solar panels and may have found a grant source to help - we will know more next week.

We need to install electric vehicle charge points in conjunction with the Parish Council (as it is their carpark) as part of the planning requirements and again we have identified a small grant. The PC is looking at other funding sources for EV charge points.

4. Funding the project

Bromham Parish Council has now transferred the first portion of the insurance funds into the BCH account. We will request the remaining portion shortly. All the Community Hub building funds are being held in a deposit account gaining interest.

We have £300,000 from the Community Ownership Fund of which £50,000 of the grant is specified to be used for running the charity and for project expenses before the construction contract is in place, so we will use this for professional fees incurred and other revenue expenses we have to meet.

The anticipated target funding needed for the construction project (to be confirmed once tenders are back in) is £1,200,000 + £50,000 COF revenue. Taking into account current and anticipated grant funding, and the fantastic total of £74,500 that the village has already raised, we now have a target of £89,000 that we need to raise. In time we will need additional funds to put furniture and equipment in the building after it is handed over to us, as well as to landscape the exterior.

5. Donations and Fundraising

We now know we have a target of £89,000 to be raised by as many different ways as we can think of. A steady stream of donations are coming in including business and personal donations, donations through salary sacrifice schemes as well as our Buy a Brick donations. The tea towel, Carnival, Teddy Bear Trail and many other initiatives are all helping us along the way and we are so grateful. There are building materials 'at cost' pledges, 8000 engineering bricks for below ground and a donation of £10,000 of plumbing supplies. Thank you to everyone who has contributed. It is really welcome. Keep it coming.

Ways to Donate

We do need to really make a push over the next 3 months as we must have all the money in the bank to be able to sign the construction contract and have an extra contingency fund for just in case!

After the contract is signed we will need to continue fundraising, for furniture, audio visual equipment, stage equipment, kitchens to be fitted out and for the landscaping but we will tackle this one step at a time.

6. Sub Contractor Opportunities

Once BCH has awarded the main construction contract, BCH will have no involvement at all over who the contractor appoints to take on smaller work packages such as plastering, glazing, plumbing etc. as they alone will tender these. However, we are going to stipulate in the contract that all businesses linked to the community of Bromham are to be given the opportunity to quote for works packages. It may be that the business is actually based in Bromham or that employees live in Bromham. We will provide this list of information to the winning contractor.

Therefore, all businesses wishing to be on the sub-contractors list that we send to the main contractor, need to let us know now. It will be up to you to tender/quote in the normal way directly with whichever main contractor BCH appoints, but if you are on the "Bromham Community Hub Subcontractor List" we provide, then the contractor should invite tenders/quotes from you. The lower you can quote the better - this way Bromham businesses can donate their skills and expertise and help keep our costs down.

To be added to the list you will need to email: contact@bromhamhub.org with the following information

- a) the name and address of your business
- b) what type of business you are and details of the type of sub contract work you would like to offer the project/receive request to quote
- c) an example of a previous sub-contract and the name of the main contractor in that example
- d) the best email contact address that should be used by the main contractor to get in touch for a quote/tender price.
- e) a phone number
- f) how you are linked to Bromham (eg home address or business address)

Obviously we hope that Bromham quotes are the lowest and give the Hub good quality products and service.

7. Expanding our team

We have drawn in extra expertise from the village to help the five Trustees in key areas. Some of these people have businesses as well as expertise. In order that we are above board with everything, all Trustees and all these 'Registered Volunteers' are expected to declare *Conflicts of Interest*. This means that where an individual or indeed a close relative, has a business interest or personal interest that could benefit from any of the work going on for BCH, their declaration means they must step away from any meeting, discussion or the process buying of goods and services and leave those decisions to others. It does not mean those businesses cannot be included or considered, but someone with a conflict of interest cannot be involved in making those appointments or purchasing decisions in any way. The Charity Commission is clear on this process, as is the Community Ownership Fund, and it is stated within the BCH constitution.

Currently we have called on the technical expertise of village residents to form the 'Hub Tech' team as well as for the Buy A Brick scheme. We thank them all for their time and commitment to the project. We intend that this is just the start of involving more people from the village who can contribute time and expertise to making this project successful.

8. Membership

Bromham Community Hub (the CIO) has a governing document called a constitution which sets out how the charity will operate – much like the Articles of Association for a company. Ultimate responsibility rests with the charity trustees, who are effectively the board of the charitable company.

Bromham Community Hub was set up with a wider voting membership who will vote on important decisions (usually at AGMs). Members are responsible for decisions such as amending the constitution and winding up of the CIO, and appointing the trustees who will run the charity. The functions of the members of a CIO are like those of shareholders of a private company. Following our constitution, the first AGM of Bromham Community Hub must be held in October 2024.

We plan to start the process of recruiting members soon. Details and an application form will be in the next Hoot and online. We also plan to hold a kickoff meeting to introduce the trustees, to update the village on progress towards the new building and to answer questions as well as for membership applications to be submitted.

Membership of Bromham Community Hub is automatically open to any individual who is resident in, and registered on the electoral register of, the Parish of Bromham. The trustees also have discretion to approve applications for membership of BCH from individuals who are resident outside the Parish who have strong links with the village or village organisations.



Notes from the Belfry

At 11.40 pm on 31st December a group of us converged on the church and climbed the stairs to the ringing chamber to carry out a centuries old tradition of bidding farewell to the old year and welcoming in the new.

Some churches half muffle their bells (as we do for Remembrance) as a symbol of mourning the passing of the old year, then remove the muffles just before midnight to ring the bells open in celebration of the start of the new year.

Some churches 'fire' the bells in celebration. That means all the bells are rung simultaneously creating a loud clashing sound. It takes some practice to do this accurately, especially on the lighter bells, since they must be held on the balance and the rope pulled fractionally later than the tenor rope to allow for the different size wheels,

We don't do either of these, but five minutes before the hour we start ringing 'diminishing rounds' where all six bells ring in turn then, one by one, starting with the treble, the lighter bells drop out until only the tenor is left to sound the twelve blows at midnight. At the final blow, all the other bells join in with rounds on all six. This is trickier than it sounds as the tenor has to maintain a steady beat throughout so there is enough of a gap for the other five bells to fit in.

And when the ringing finally stops? We hang up the ropes, set up a table and bring out the mulled wine and nibbles for a midnight feast.

On 27th April a visiting band from Salisbury will be coming to ring the bells from 10.00 - 10.45am. We are always pleased to welcome visitors either to ring or to observe. If you would like to find out more about bell ringing just come up any Tuesday between 19.45 and 21.00 when we hold our weekly practice.
